DAY 1 : DEPART FOR KENYA



Your incredible East African safari begins today! Depart on your international flight to Kenya, where your journey into some of the world's most spectacular wildlife reserves awaits.

DAY 2 : ARRIVE IN NAIROBI

Welcome to **Nairobi**, the capital city of **Kenya** and the gateway to your thrilling safari adventure. After arrival and customs clearance, you'll be transferred to your hotel to relax and recover from the flight.

DAY 3 : TRAVEL TO LAKE NAKURU NATIONAL PARK & GAME DRIVE



After breakfast, head towards **Lake Nakuru National Park**, known for its diverse ecosystem and birdlife. Check in to your lodge in time for lunch. In the afternoon, embark on a scenic game drive where you may spot endangered white and black rhinos, flamingos, zebras, and giraffes. The evening includes an orientation meeting with your Tour Manager, followed by a welcome dinner at the lodge.

DAY 4 : AFTERNOON GAME DRIVE IN MASAI MARA NATIONAL RESERVE



Begin your day early with a journey to the world-famous **Masai Mara National Reserve**. After checking into your safari camp and enjoying lunch, head out on an exciting afternoon game drive. Keep your eyes peeled for wildlife among the acacia-dotted plains—lions, cheetahs, elephants, and perhaps even a stealthy leopard.

DAY 5 : FULL DAY GAME DRIVES IN MASAI MARA



Enjoy a full day of game viewing in the **Masai Mara**, one of Africa's top safari destinations. Today's drives focus on tracking the **"Big Five": lion, elephant, buffalo, leopard, and rhino**. The Mara's rich ecosystem offers countless photo opportunities and unforgettable wildlife encounters. Tonight, share stories over dinner as you toast your final night in the Mara.

DAY 6 : CROSS INTO TANZANIA & ENTER SERENGETI NATIONAL PARK

Leave **Masai Mara** and drive toward the Isebania border crossing into Tanzania. After clearing immigration at Sirari, bid farewell to your Kenyan guide and meet your Tanzanian safari guide. Enjoy lunch at the border before continuing to **Serengeti National Park**. As you enter the Serengeti, enjoy a scenic game drive on the way to your camp, soaking in the vast grasslands dotted with wildlife.

Note: Today's drive is long (approx. 8-9 hours), depending on road and border conditions.

DAY 7 : GAME DRIVES IN SERENGETI NATIONAL PARK

Optional: Begin your day with a breathtaking **Serengeti Sunrise Balloon Safari**, followed by a champagne breakfast in the bush. Afterwards, continue exploring the endless plains on morning and afternoon game drives. The Serengeti offers unmatched wildlife viewing, with high chances to see predators on the hunt or herds in migration depending on the season.

Optional: Serengeti Balloon Safari (AM)

Overnight: Serengeti National Park



DAY 8 : NGORONGORO CONSERVATION AREA & CRATER GAME DRIVE

B/L/D

After breakfast, travel to the **UNESCO-listed Ngorongoro Conservation Area**. Descend 2,000 feet into the **Ngorongoro Crater**, an extinct volcanic caldera teeming with wildlife—zebras, wildebeests, flamingos, and possibly the endangered black rhino. Enjoy lunch before the descent and continue your drive to the lodge for a restful evening.

Overnight: Ngorongoro Conservation Area



DAY 9 : CROSS INTO KENYA, TRAVEL TO AMBOSELI NATIONAL PARK

B/L/D

Depart Ngorongoro and drive to Arusha. After a delightful lunch at **Elewana Arusha Lodge** and a visit to the **Shanga Center**—an inspiring glass-blowing and artisan project—you'll proceed to the Namanga border to re-enter Kenya. Meet your Kenyan Tour Manager and continue to **Amboseli National Park**. Enjoy a game drive en route and arrive in time for dinner.

Overnight: Amboseli National Park

DAY 10 : FULL DAY IN AMBOSELI NATIONAL PARK

B/L/D

Explore the stunning **Amboseli National Park**, famed for its elephant herds and breathtaking views of **Mount Kilimanjaro**. Today's game drives offer exceptional chances to photograph elephants, giraffes, zebras, and perhaps even lions in the golden light. This evening, share a farewell dinner and relive the unforgettable moments from your East African adventure.

YELLOW FEVER VACCINATION IS MANATORY FOR MALAYSIANS

Uniqueness of Destination: Several accommodations are built in the traditional local style and have no air-conditioning. Some hotels don't have electricity available during the night and guests requiring power for medical devices must notify Gate 1 in advance. An additional fee will apply for electricity charges. Some of the tours require walking or climbing stairs between tents.

- **Things to Consider:** Expect several days with early mornings. This tour uses 4X4 safari vehicles that have high ground clearance and require agility to embark and disembark. Driving is over roads that are often rough, and bumpy in safari vehicles that cannot be air-conditioned. Only "bush toilets" are available during game drives. This tour includes animal-related activities which carry inherent risks, as animal behavior can be unpredictable. You may choose not to participate. Visitors to Kenya are required to carry proof of yellow fever vaccination if traveling through or from a country with risk of yellow fever and are encouraged to consult their health care providers regarding malaria prophylaxis. We suggest you check with your health care provider before signing up for this tour.
- **Transportation:** There is one day with over 7 hours of driving. Additionally, there are nine days with 7-8 hours spent in a safari vehicle driving over rough terrain.
- **Pace:** Expect 1-2 hours of walking on included sightseeing days, as well as considerable time standing.
- **Terrain:** On this tour, you may need to walk on uneven and challenging terrain, navigate steep steps or slopes.
- **Travel Style:** This is a Small Group program

Climate & Clothing

Kenya - The weather in Kenya varies according to geographical area. Generally, the weather is warm with cooler weather in the early morning and evenings. The hottest period is from February to March and the coolest from July to August. The rainy season is from April to June and short rains occur from October and December as well. Bring comfortable walking shoes, clothes you can layer, and an all-weather jacket. Sunscreen, hat, and sunglasses are also recommended. A bandanna or light scarf is recommended as protection against dust and dirt on game drives. Pack a DEET-based repellent to prevent mosquito bites. On game reserves, it is recommended to wear neutral colors such as khaki and beige, which are most comfortable during the heat of the day. In some areas, mostly along the coast, it is considered inappropriate to wear shorts or short sleeve shirts. Binoculars are a must for wildlife viewing, and a long-range lens is recommended for photography.

Tanzania -

Due to its location near the equator, Tanzania does not have a lot of seasonal variation. Generally, the weather is pleasant. The rainy season is from April to May and short rains occur from November to December as well. Bring comfortable walking shoes, clothes you can layer, and an all-weather jacket. Sunscreen, hat, and sunglasses are also recommended.

A bandanna or light scarf is recommended as protection against dust and dirt on game drives. Pack a DEET-based repellent to prevent mosquito bites. On game reserves, it is recommended to wear neutral colors such as khaki and beige, which are most comfortable during the heat of the day. In some areas it is considered inappropriate to wear shorts or short sleeve shirts. Binoculars are a must for wildlife viewing, and a long-range lens is recommended for photography.

About Your Accommodations

Hotels

We carefully selected each hotel based on overall quality, location, price, service, and cleanliness. All rooms are standard twin-bedded (two single beds) rooms with private facilities. Special requests such as bed types, smoking preference and connecting rooms are subject to availability. Room selection in all cases, unless otherwise reserved, is strictly at the discretion of the hotel's management on a run-of-house basis. Triple rooms consist of standard twin beds or one double bed plus a sofa/folding bed or cot for third person except in the U.S. and Canada, where triple rooms often consist of two double/queen beds for three persons; where available, a fee may be charged by the hotel for the addition of a cot/rollaway. The number of persons accommodated does not dictate the room size.

While air conditioning is available in most hotels, we recommend checking the room amenities listed under the "Featured Hotels" tab of your package to confirm. Please note that many international hotels were built before central air conditioning was introduced. In those that do offer air conditioning, usage may be restricted, often due to government regulations aimed at promoting energy conservation. It's typical for air conditioning to be used only during the summer months, to follow a set schedule (sometimes turned off at night), and to operate at lower settings than what many of us are accustomed to. Some lodges and accommodations in remote regions may not have all of the amenities, such as hairdryer, alarm clock and room service, that you might find in a larger hotel located in a city center.

On Safari - Electricity for some camps and lodges is provided by generator and may not be available 24 hours a day.

Mara Maisha Camp & Kibo Safari Lodge - accommodations for extended electricity will incur an additional fee of 60 USD per stay.

Hotel Check-in/ Check-out

Hotel check-in time is generally not before 4:00 p.m. and check-out time is prior to noon. If you will be arriving early in the day or departing in the evening, hotels will usually allow you to store your luggage in their luggage room. Ask at the front desk if the hotel can check you in earlier, or let you stay later.
